

Friends of the Siegfried H. Horn Endowed Scholarship Fund

About the fund:

The Friends of the Siegfried H. Horn Endowed Scholarship Fund was established by the Institute of Archaeology in 1995 as a memorial to Siegfried H. Horn, founder of the Horn Archaeological Museum. The award is intended to broaden the perspective of a future minister, who is also interested in archaeology, by allowing that person to gain personal experience visiting the Holy Land and participating in the archaeological excavation sponsored by the Andrews University Theological Seminary. **Recipients of this scholarship must be Master of Divinity students who have taken two seminary archaeology classes. Scholarships are to be used to cover costs associated with transportation and accommodations while on seminary-sponsored archaeological projects. The scholarship will not cover the entire cost of the dig. The scholarship is not disbursed until after the dig is complete, and the awardee has successfully participated in the dig.**

Who should apply:

Any student in good and regular standing with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher who is currently enrolled full-time in the Master of Divinity program at the Andrews University Theological Seminary, who has taken two seminary archaeology classes and plans to participate in the entire dig season. Applicants must have a positive Christian attitude that is compatible with the spiritual values of the Seminary.

How to apply:

Write a 750 word essay describing what qualifies you for the scholarship, how you will benefit from having participated in the archaeological dig, and what you think you will positively contribute to the dig. Complete the attached application form and submit it along with your essay to the following address (or email address) by March 1, 2021. You will be notified once a decision is made.
